Council Member De Forrest requested that Council have the opportunity to make a decision on the site for the boat launch after the public hearings are held.

Council Member De Forrest announced that he was pleased to present a proclamation to the Irish Club on behalf of Mayor Moss last Sunday.



Council Member De Forrest thanked staff from the Police and Fire departments for their assistance for apprehending the stalker of children at several elementary schools in Council District 4.
