FINAL READING OF ORDINANCES:

Amending Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to reclassify the property located on the west side of East "D" Street between East 32nd Street and East Wright Avenue from a "R-4-L" Low Density Multiple-Family Dwelling District to a "R-4-T" Residential Commercial Transitional District to construct a 44,600 square foot office building on the site. Accepting \$2,250.00 from the Allied Arts of Tacoma/Pierce County, Children's Museum of Tacoma, Nalley's Fine Foods, Preston Thorgrimson Ellis & Holman, Second City Chamber Series, Tacoma Actor's Guild, University of Puget Sound and the Washington State Historical Society; and depositing in and appropriating said sum from the General Fund to defray the expenses involved in the publication of the ARTBREAK brochure.

Resolution No. 31085

Authorizing the execution of an extension to the lease agreement with the Good-Ward Corporation for space at 1925 Commerce Street for the Home Repair Section of the Community Development Department from October 1, 1990, to September 30, 1991.

Council Member Nielsen moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Mykland. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31086

Authorizing the submittal of project prospectuses to the Washington State Department of Transportation in the amount of \$11,980,321.00; and further authorizing the execution of related documents and agreements.

Council Member Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member McElliott.

Council Member Moss stated that he works for the Washington State Department of Transportation. He stated that these projects do not directly affect his position and he is not in any way involved in the decision making end of this process. He noted that this would not affect his vote on this matter tonight.

Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31087

Authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Washington State Department of Natural Resources to lease approximately one acre of harbor area north and easterly of the Old Town Dock for breakwater and moorage slips for the proposed transient moorage facility.

Council Member Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Moss. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31088

Confirming the action taken by the City Council at the meeting with initiating parties on October 2, 1990, regarding the proposed annexation of property located between the City of Tacoma on the north, east and west, and the City of Fife on the south. (Port of Tacoma)

Council Member Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Evans. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31089

Authorizing the execution of an agreement with Osborne-McCann Cadillac for the use of Cadillac vehicles for the Drug Awareness Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Program.

Council Member Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Moss. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31090

Waiving competitive bidding for the Phase II Environmental Studies for the acquisition of properties on Foss Waterway; and further authorizing the expenditure of \$60,000.00 for the cost of said studies.

Council Member Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Miller. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31091

Authorizing the execution of an agreement with Smith, Alling and Lane in the amount of \$30,000.00 to represent the City in the case of <u>United States</u>, et <u>al., v. Tacoma</u>, regarding the denial of the application of the Consent Decree negotiated between the Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Ecology and the City for the clean up of the Tacoma Landfill.

Council Member Mykland moved to suspend the rules to consider Substitute Resolution No. 31091. Seconded by Council Member Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Mayor Vialle moved that the Substitute Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Mykland.

Council Member Moss stated that the law firm of Smith, Alling and Lane represents him, but this would not affect his decision on the vote on this matter tonight.

Voice vote was taken and carried. The Substitute Resolution was declared adopted.

Mayor Vialle proclaimed the day of October 13, 1990, to be "Bacon Bowl Day," and presented the proclamation to Assistance Police Chief Jim Hairston.

PUBLIC HEARINGS AND APPEALS: (Began at 5:30 p.m.)

This is the date set for a public hearing regarding an amendment to the Official Code to eliminate the exception to the 25 feet height requirements for buildings within any development or subdivision greater than 30 acres within view-sensitive districts.
