Mr. Hudson commented on Seattle's decision on energy, which he understood they fait they would not need any more power besides the Cherry Creek until around 1995. He also commented he understood the surplus power of WPPSS only goes to 1995. He asked whether the City of Tacoma should consider an investment looking at those risks and the factors that might produce some dividends in the long run for the City in the area of electrical power supply.
