FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES:

Ordinance No. 24816

Amending Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to reclassify the property located on the southeast corner of North 11th and Pearl Streets, south of the existing Pay-N-Pak Store, from a "CPN" Planned Neighborhood Shopping Center District to a "C-2" Commercial District to allow the development of a self-service storage warehouse facility. Council Member Moss moved to strike Condition No. 11 of the Hearings Examiner's Report on page 169 of their material to delete the words: "due to the fire lane width requirements and turning radii needed for fire trucks." Seconded by Mayor Vialle. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Mayor Vialle moved to concur in the Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations of the Hearings Examiner. Seconded by Council Member Moss. Voice vote was taken and carried, with Council Member Evans voting nay. The motion was declared adopted.

Vacating a portion of the north 18 feet of North 32nd Street west from Alder Street to combine the vacated area with the abutting properties in order to assure continued use as landscaped and/or maintained yard space. (Charles B. Moe; File No. 124.926)

Deputy Mayor Stenger moved to concur in the Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations of the Hearing Examiner. Seconded by Mayor Vialle. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Final reading of the Ordinance was set over to a date to be determined.

Ordinance No. 24818

Amending Chapter 12.06 of the Official Code regarding Electric Energy - Regulations and Rates to modify the Supplemental City of Fife Service Schedule F, to reflect the change made in the Utility Tax levied by the City of Fife effective February 1, 1991.

Adopting the revised 1991 Affirmative Action Plan for the City of Tacoma.

Mayor Vialle asked the City Manager to thank Mr. Greg Clark for his outstanding job as a Special Assistant in the City Manager's office for the prior three-month period.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF CITY COUNCIL:

Council Member Nielsen requested to know who had erected the sign on the corner of Pioneer Way and River Road, which says "Welcome to the City of Tacoma." He noted that it was artfully done, multi-colored and gave his congratulations to the Public Works Department for this sign.

Mayor Vialle stated that a "job well done" should be passed on to the crews who worked in the Public Works Department in the recent snowy weather. Also, she conveyed her thanks to the Public Utilities crews who worked during the bad weather.

Council Member Evans stated that during the Paul Simon concert at the Tacoma Dome, he noted that the lights on the East 34th Street Bridge were not on. He requested to know why these were not turned on during this event.

Mayor Vialle thanked the Department of Emergency Services and Bill Lokey and US Oil and Refining and Bill Dabrock for the outstanding job they did in the recent oil spill.
