Mayor Baarsma expressed his appreciation to City Manager James Walton for his leadership throughout the Breakthrough Initiative process.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF CITY COUNCIL

Deputy Mayor Ladenburg moved to excuse Council Member Phelps from tonight's meeting. Seconded by Council Member Talbert. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Deputy Mayor Ladenburg stated there is an upcoming Joint Public Safety and Human Services Committee/Pierce County Council meeting to discuss moving forward with a plan to review the City/County Department of Corrections and the Department of Social and Health Services facilities. She encouraged citizens to attend.

Council Member Evans reported on the Northwest Public Power Producers Association Convention he attended.

Council Member Talbert mentioned the recent celebration for the "Incubator of the Year" at the William Factory Small Business Incubator. He stated it was greatly attended including Council Members Evans and Manthou, Mayor Baarsma and Congressman Adam Smith. He stated there was a group in town to study ways to improve the Portland Avenue corridor.

He stated City Manager James Walton presented a special award to Ms. Judie Fortier, recent City of Tacoma retiree, for helping the disabled over the years. He also mentioned the upcoming Government Performance and Finance Committee meeting where discussions will include moving forward with the Audit Committee and the contract with IBM for the Performance Audit on our Business Information Systems Department.

Mayor Baarsma stated writer Mr. David McCullough, who has written biographies of John Adams, Harry S. Truman, and many others will be in Tacoma on Thursday, June 15, 2005, and invited citizens to meet with them.
