Deputy Mayor Nielsen moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Rasmussen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 27319

Authorizing the execution of an agreement with Fort Steilacoom Community College and an amendment to the agreement with the Washington State Employment Security Department to provide training and allowance services to participants in the Semiconductor Technician Training Program.

Councilwoman Bichsel moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Rasmussen. Voice vote was taken and carried with Councilman Hyde abstaining. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 27320

Approving the Statement of Policy Positions and Legislative Goals identifying areas of concern regarding proposed federal legislation.

Mayor Sutherland informed the Council that the staff has requested that this resolution be removed from the agenda.

Deputy Mayor Nielsen moved that the Resolution be removed from the agenda. Seconded by Councilwoman Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was removed from the agenda.

Resolution No. 27321

Authorizing and fixing a new interest rate on outstanding General Obligation Stadium Warrants for the Tacoma Dome.

Councilwoman Bichsel moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconed by Deputy Mayor Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Mayor Sutherland moved to suspend the rules to consider Citizens Request to be Heard as they were running ahead of time and the parties involved in the Hearings and Appeals had not yet arrived. Seconded by Councilman Ladenburg. Voice yote was taken and carried.

CITIZENS REQUEST TO BE HEARD:

Raymond J. Roland requesting to speak regarding a water problem on the east side and the ordinance governing honey bees in the city:

Mayor Sutherland informed Mr. Roland that under Council Rules the usual approach is to allow Citizens To Be Heard to speak on just one item and Mr. Roland has indicated he wishes to speak on two items.

Mayor Sutherland moved to allow Mr. Roland to speak on both items as long as he maintains the subject matter within the ten minute time limit. Seconded by Deputy Mayor Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried.

Raymond J. Roland spoke regarding the water problem on the east side and asked that the Mayor appoint a committee to look into the water situation. He went on to discuss the ordinance governing honey bees in the city and the fact that bees should be at least 100 feet from the nearest residence. He stated that the city ordinance regarding bees is very weak and needs to be updated. Mayor Sutherland asked the City Manager to research the bee ordinance and Councilman Ladenburg suggested that part of the ordinance should read that if someone is going to keep bees there should be a certain amount of open space within an appropriate area around the area where they are keeping bees.

Councilman Strege informed the Council that Stephanie McIntosh of the City Manager's office had done some research and had sent the Health Department out to the location. They found no violations with the 1947 ordinance, which we have but did suggest some changes that we should consider, that Seattle is now considering, with regard to bee hives. Councilman Strege asked that this material be forwarded to all the members of the Council and they could provide their input as the Health Department might in the drafting of a new ordinance on the subject.

Councilman Hawkins moved that the Council recess for a period of ten minutes to await the arrival of the parties involved in the appeal. Seconded by Deputy Mayor Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried. Council recessed at 5:50 p.m. and reconvened at 6:02 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARINGS AND APPEALS: (6:02 p.m.)

This is the date set for hearing the appeal of Micahel B. Elliott and Robert R. Galluction the recommendation of the Hearings Examiner to uphold the decision of the Acting Land Use Administrator regarding a parking variance at the northwest and southwest corners of South 10th and "I Streets as requested by Honizon Associates"
