Ordinance No. 22964

Changing the name of South 40th and South Ferry Streets from South Steele Street to South 56th Street to Tacoma Mall Boulevard.

Councilman Kirby moved to deny the Findings, Conclusions, and Recommendations of the Hearings Examiner and overturn the decision of the Hearings Examiner. Seconded by Councilwoman Bichsel.

Roll call vote was taken, resulting as follows:

Ayes: 6 - Bichsel, Hawkins, Hyde, Kirby, Ladenburg, and Strege.

Nays: 3 - Nielsen, Rasmussen and Mayor Sutherland.

The motion was declared adopted.

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Deputy Mayor Nielsen changed his vote from negative to affirmative for purposes of reconsideration.

After further discussion, the motion was amended by adding the words: "and modify the condition requiring the renaming accordingly."

Councilman Kirby and Councilwoman Bichsel concurred with the amendment to the motion.

Mayor Sutherland moved to authorize travel costs for all councilmembers attending next week's Energy Conference in Vancouver, British Columbia. Seconded by Councilman Ladenburg. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Councilwoman Bichsel requested that the City Attorney investigate the legal implications for the City relative to cancelling the contractual relationships on the Victim Witness Assistance Program with Pierce County.

Councilman Strege requested that the time for the Budget Workshop on July 28, 1983, be changed to 5:00 p.m.

Councilman Ladenburg requested that staff investigate how much money was left in the Project Need Fund and report back to the Council before the budget hearing on July 28, 1983.

Mayor Sutherland requested that staff investigate methods of deferring the Police School Liaison Program until a later date.

Councilman Strege requested that staff report back to Council on the level of the Contingency Fund and the implications of returning portions of that fund to the General Fund.

Deputy Mayor Nielsen requested to meet with the City Manager on Fire Department personnel reductions.

Mayor Sutherland reminded the City Council that there would be no regular meeting of the City Council on July 19, 1983, but that there will be a public hearing on proposed City Charter amendments on July 21, 1983.
